

# Dog sitter instructions

Walks, feeding, lead rules, triggers, settling and emergency contacts.

## DOG AND ROUTINE

### Dog name, age and useful description

Rowan, 6-year-old tan lurcher.

### Meals, water and treats

One labelled scoop at 08:00 and 18:00. Two training treats after the morning walk.

### Walk times, duration and usual route

30 minutes after breakfast; quiet park loop shown during handover.

### Toileting and sleep routine

Garden after meals and before bed. Sleeps downstairs.

## WALK AND BEHAVIOUR SAFETY

### Lead, harness and equipment location

Harness and fixed lead on the hall hook.

### On-lead or off-lead rule

On lead at all times.

### Triggers, greetings and other-dog boundaries

Cross the road for off-lead dogs. No doorstep greetings.

### Escape risks and handling notes

Latch the side gate before opening the back door.

### Current medication or None

None.

## CONTACTS AND HANDOVER

### Owner and agreed backup

Alex first; Sam is the agreed local backup.

### Regular vet and out-of-hours route

Checked practice number; voicemail gives the current emergency provider.

### Supply locations, updates and return checks

Food by sink; towels in utility room. Send one evening update and check the gate.

### IMPORTANT

Follow the established lead, handling and veterinary instructions. Do not change a dog's routine or medication without the owner's or vet's agreement.
